



CAN THE GREASE

Support the Can the Grease Campaign to prevent clogged house drains & sewer spills...

- ◇ Never pour grease or oil into sinks, toilets, or drains
- ◇ Bake or grill foods instead of frying them to produce less oil waste
- ◇ Wipe greasy cookware and utensils with a paper towel before washing
- ◇ Collect cooled cooking grease in an empty metal food can and refrigerate. When can is full, discard it in the trash

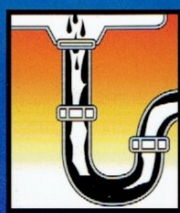


DON'T pour grease down your drain!

Grease builds up and will eventually block the pipe. When this happens, the drain backs up into the sink. If the clog is in a sewer pipe, raw sewage can back up into your house!

1. Pour or scrape grease from pots and pans into your grease can.
2. Store the can in your refrigerator.
3. Wipe out any residue with a PAPER towel and throw away.
4. When the can is full and the grease is chilled solid, throw it in the garbage.

Pour used liquid frying oil into containers that can be capped and thrown out.



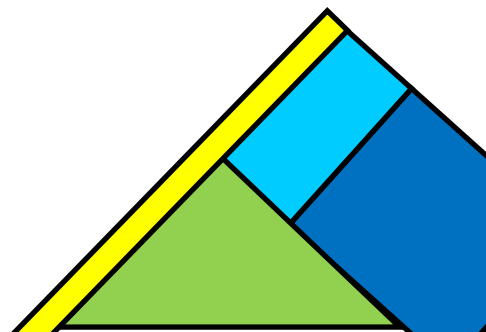
Hot water does NOT dissolve grease...
it just pushes grease down the drain, where it quickly cools and sticks to the inside of the pipe.

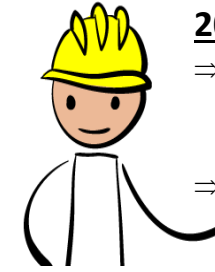

2024 Performance Report

- ⇒ Completed all required yearly inspections and maintenance
- ⇒ Mailed Fats, Oils, & Grease information to wastewater customers

No Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO's) of the County wastewater system occurred in 2024.

Davidson County operates & maintains approximately 45 miles of public sewer mains and five wastewater pumping stations in the northwest quadrant of the county. The wastewater received by the County's collection system discharges to the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Utilities' Lower Muddy Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant located in Forsyth County.

Currently, seventy-five percent of the wastewater discharged to the County collection system originates from residences. Approximately twenty percent of the wastewater volume is received from public schools and the remaining five percent is commercial use.
