



ADULT DAY CARE/ADULT DAY HEALTH

Adult Day Care and Adult Day Health services are provided in a community group setting during the day for adults with cognitive and/or physical impairments offering supervision, assistance with Activities of Daily Living (ADLs), opportunities for socialization and stimulation and physical, mental and emotional enrichment based on each participant's individual needs. Adult Day Care/Health services enable aging and/or persons with disabilities whose impairments prohibit them from living independently without supportive services during the day, to continue residing in the community rather than in an institution, and support primary caregivers of persons in need of these services by providing respite and/or the ability to work outside of the caregiver role to financially support him/herself and potentially the person for whom they are primary caregiver. Adult Day Health services also provide professional nursing services including monitoring of a medical condition, administration of medication, special feedings and provision of other treatment or services related to health care needs.

There are two types of Adult Day Services: Adult Day Care and Adult Health Care. Adult Day Care provides social activities, meals, recreation and some health-related services. Adult Day Health care offers more intensive health, therapeutic and social services for individuals with chronic diseases and those at risk of requiring nursing home care.

Questions to ask the staff when visiting a center:

- 1) Can the center provide you with any written documentation such as brochures, calendars, and menus?
- 2) Does the center have a license, certification and/or accreditation?
- 3) What are the hours of operation?
- 4) Are transportation services offered?
- 5) What is the cost?
- 6) Hourly or daily charge; any other charges?
- 7) What type of payment is accepted?
- 8) Is financial assistance available?
- 9) Is specialized care provided for conditions such as memory loss?
- 10) What is the staff-to-participant ratio?
- 11) What kind of training does staff receive?
- 12) Do participants have access to services such as physical or occupational therapy?
- 13) What type of activities are provided?
- 14) Are meals and/or snacks provided?

Questions to ask yourself after visiting a center:

- 1) Did you feel welcome?
- 2) Were the center services and activities properly explained?
- 3) Were you given information regarding staffing, programming, and costs?
- 4) Is the center clean, pleasant and free of odor?
- 5) Is the building and site wheelchair accessible?
- 6) Is the furniture sturdy and comfortable?
- 7) Are there loungers and chairs with arms for relaxation if appropriate?
- 8) Is there a quiet place in the center?
- 9) Did the staff and participants seem cheerful and comfortable?
